



Gaming Commission

- A copy of the 2012 Compliance Report issued by the NIGC was received on 15 May 2013. The Commission was noted as being late on supplying the supporting documentation for the (then) semi-annual fee payments; they were submitted by CNE after the fee payment deadline. The Commission can expect to receive the same notation next year as, again, CNE failed to submit the paperwork along with the fee payment. After discussing the issue with CFO Doug Evans, I believe we now have a process in place to ensure the proper filing of all supporting documents along with each fee payment.

Cherokee Nation Entertainment

- The NEWave Title 31 system has been implemented at all tribal locations
 and will be installed at Will Rogers Downs in July. We will meet with CNE to
 determine if any changes to the system and/or policies are necessary and, if
 so, will bring them to the Commission at the July meeting.
- The Andover system (access control system) has been installed at the Ramona facility. A review of the installation process and draft policies will now be performed to identify any implementation improvements / necessary modifications. If changes to the policies are necessary, they will

be presented to the Commission at a future Commission meeting. National Indian Gaming Commission

- ∞ The 2013 final fee rate was published in the Federal Register on 4 June 2013. The rate was provided to CNE for use in calculating the second quarterly fee payment, which is due by 31 June 2013.
- The agency determined that the electronic submissions of background investigation reports submitted by tribes does not meet federal security standards and cannot be accepted until they have a compliant system available. Effective 17 June 2013, the CNGC staff will revert to the submission of hard-copy documents to the NIGC to satisfy the licensing requirements under 25 CFR. The NIGC is currently looking at options for tribes desiring to transmit personal identifiable information (PII) via encrypted email. Before the NIGC can accept PII electronically, it must ensure that the appropriate safeguards are established so that all incoming information is adequately protected. Once a new system is in place, we will notify the Commission.

Other Events

- ▼ I volunteered to host the Oklahoma Tribal Gaming Regulators Association
 Fall Conference on October 29th & 30th at the Hard Rock location. There was
 a second volunteer, which will require the OTGRA Board to decide whether
 the conference will be held. I will let you know their decision once it is
 received.
- ∞ The next bi-monthly meeting of the Oklahoma Tribal Gaming Regulators Association will be held on Tuesday, 25 June 2013 at the Indigo Sky Casino, an operation of the Eastern Band of Shawnee in Wyandotte, OK.
