Call To Order

Ms Angela Drewes recognized and gave appreciation to the fish fry cooks.

Chair Martin called the meeting to order.

Invocation

Approval of Minutes

Council member Shotpouch made a motion to approve the minutes of the April 16th regular session. Councilman Jack Baker seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Reports

1. Natural Resources

Angela Drewes

Ms. Angela Drewes introduced her staff members in attendance. Together in conjunction with Realty they purchased 255 acres on Ross road in Muskogee County. This property is in the acquisition are of the ARB funds. They assisted with the redesign work at the pow wow grounds. She reported the Chief has assigned the proprietary portion of the hunting and fishing code to Natural Resources. This makes them responsible for the issuance of licenses, permits, and inventory. They will be working with the Marshal Service on the enforcement and education. There has been a budget turned in to enable them to hire the staff needed. She announced they continue to work with the FLYE community of interest. They provided a power point presentation regarding this community of interest. They continue to work with CNE on the wind energy grant. This grant has been handed over to CNB. This is a project that is being studied on the Chillocco property. They met with CNE in regard with cultural tourism and historical data needs. A staff member is doing the backhoe work for the Tailholt community self help water line. They completed the mapping of the Indian owned businesses. They are in the process of editing the cancer data to map the number of women enrolled in cancer treatment within the jurisdictional

boundaries. She stated they are in the progress of updating their historical site files. The gravel has been spread at the Rocky Mountain track project. GEO data completed 366 requests for the month of April.

Mr. Pat Gwin provided an update on the ethno botany program. He announced the first meeting had approximately 70 visitors some as far away as Dallas. They will be focusing on the cultural aspect of ethno botany and not the spiritual aspect. He provided a power point presentation.

2. Real Estate Services

Linda Donelson

Ms. Linda Donelson introduced her staff member in attendance. She stated Real Estate Services has received and returned 955 phone calls, had 93 individual clients in the office, completed 32 site inspections, completed 5 probate inventories on trust land and 2 on restricted land. They had 7 home visits, 14 jurisdictional calls, 3 quiet titles 1 will interview, and several county researches, filing of documents, and certifying copies. She announced they received the deed for the Owens school property. This school adjoins land already owned by the Cherokee Nation. They are looking at property in Collinsville for a community building along side of the Victory cemetery. She provided a power point presentation for the Realty department.

3. Roads & Transportation

Mr. Michael Lynn announced the Daytown Drycreek project has been awarded. He provided the following update of IRR roads:

Mr. Lynn announced there are 3 motor fuel/motor vehicle projects from Cherokee County this month going to executive and finance committee all of which are bridge projects. These projects are Alberty bridge, McLlemore Hollow bridge, Kirkpatrick low water bridge. There is also a Tulsa County project for a Sperry drainage project. He stated he has other projects lacking signatures such as Strang Road, and 2 other projects in Adair County. They held a county commissioner orientation April 24th with 10 counties represented. They have had 4 staff members certified by the Oklahoma Department of Transportation for various areas of material sampling, concrete, and aggregate. He stated within the next few months they will be updating the Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP). Chair Martin requested Mr. Lynn introduce the Roads staff members present. Mr. Robert Endicott gave a brief update on the TIP program.

Ms. Jeannine Hale announced they are applying for a \$54, 570.00 radon grant with an in kind match of \$36,379.00 which will be met by the EPC budget administrator's salary.
