	Dr. Neil Morton reported on the scl to be visited this week. At the end		

will have been visited by a team from Human Resources, Education Administration, and

Higher Education. They are changing the Higher Education Program from a money disbursement center to a college counseling center. The main purpose these past two years has been to receive applications, react to those applications, disburse checks to colleges and have had minimal contact and counseling with students concerning other scholarship opportunities that may exist beyond the Cherokee Nation Scholarship. Dale Miller who has been Director of Higher Education requested to be transferred to Sequoyah High School to fill a need for a driver's education instructor due to an illness of a Sequoyah employee. Nita Wilson on an interim basis will serve as coordinator in the Higher Education Program. They have 135 new applications that are complete and 136 applications that still lack information. The Trail of Tears Awards is scheduled for Thursday, April 19, 2007 and will be held at the Crown Plaza in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Reba Bruner is requesting a list of Council Members that will be attending in order for her to add them to the list of people for whom parking fees will be paid. The Immersion Program entered the 5th Oklahoma Native American Youth Language Fair at the Sam Noble Center in Norman on April 5th and they swept the contest in both the group presentations and significantly in the individuals. The Valedictorian and Salutatorian Award checks will be ready next week and they will contact all schools and get their schedules for their awards assemblies so that those Council Members that have recipients in their districts may attend and present those awards. They sent notices to every high school in the area plus all of the high schools in the counties bordering the area which totaled 162 high schools. They followed up after the April 10th deadline by calling each school that had not responded and they had 40 valedictorians and 17 salutatorians in the area. He distributed a list with the name of the school and the name of the students should the Council members wish to send congratulatory letters. Their staff will notify the Council members of the awards assemblies or however the schools choose to make the presentations.

3. Head Start

Verna Thompson introduced and yielded her report to Diane Woodard, the Senior Program Specialist over the Education domain for Head Start. She is required to inform the Council of the National Reporting System results each year. Diane Woodard gave the second quarter report for the Head Start National Reporting System, the Cherokee Nation Early Childhood Unit 2006-2007 Outcomes Profile, and the standardized assessment.

Council member Yargee asked what kid of testing is done with students below the age level. Ms. Woodard stated that is done by individualized instruction.

4. JOM

Dr. Shelley Butler-Allen

Dr. Shelley Butler-Allen stated the 2007 Oklahoma Johnson O'Malley Conference was very successful with Cherokee Nation as the host tribe and had between 400 and 450 conference participants. She announced the 2006-2007 Cherokee Cultural Competition Awards Reception is scheduled for Thursday, May 3rd at 10:00 a.m. and will be held in the "Place Where They Play". She gave an update on the Cherokee Challenge Bowl that was held the first two weeks in April and stated they are preparing for the Cherokee Nation Youth Leadership Institute/Retracing Cherokee Footsteps which is a two week journey into Tennessee, Georgia, and North Carolina.

Council member Cowan Watts expressed concerns of parents and JOM Counselors in Rogers County and asked what would be the appropriate way of having those addressed. Dr. Butler-Allen stated she would like to field them first and if there are no resolve with the issues then the concerns will be addressed by Dr. Morton.

5. Sequoyah High School

Gina Stanley

Gina Stanley gave a reminder of the celebration that is scheduled for Tuesday, April 24th at 1:30 p.m. May 1st the basketball teams will be at the Capital and will be presented citations on the floor of both the House and the Senate. She will notify Ms. Miller with confirmation on the time for the presentation. Baccalaureate is scheduled for May 16th at 6:30 and graduation is scheduled for May 18th at 6:30 p.m. They are in the process of beginning a formal assessment for the Marshal Service in light of the Virginia Tech tragedy. BIA Engineers are visiting the campus and the purpose for their visit is to evaluate where they are at in terms of items that need to be corrected or repaired for minor improvements and also to look at backlog items that go on their FINR projects. The exit meeting was done this morning and they were impressed with the campus. The track bleachers are completed and next week they will have folks out from Albuquerque to do a final inspection and to issue a certificate of occupancy for the bleachers and the gym. She reported the school has three confirmed Gates Millennium Scholars, two students that received the Student of Today Award from the Masonic Lodge, one student who won the State Vocational Essay Contest and she will go on to compete Nationally in Florida, the Cheerleaders competed in the NCA Six Flags Over Texas Championships in Dallas, Texas and won second in the co-ed division. Angel Goodrich was named the Oklahoma Gatorade Player of the Year and Nathan Stanley was named a Pre-Season All-American. They have begun the planning and design for the library expansion and the classroom additions. They are working on the development of a new master plan for the school and are in the process of development for a 21st century grant, which is an after school and summer program and they are partnering with the Boys & Girls Club and the Cherokee Nation Education Department. They are hoping to have a strong emphasis on Math and Science.
