Chief Bill John Baker reported everyone is in full swing in preparation for the Cherokee National Holiday. He announced the Cherokee language is now available in braille. The topping out ceremony was held at the Ochelata Clinic recently. A dedication was held for a new \$2.8ml dollar road in Adair and Sequoyah County and a \$349,000 waterline in the Oaks community of Delaware County. The School Clothing Voucher Program has once again been a huge success. He requested a moment of silence for those Cherokees who we have lost over the last month.

Monthly Reports:

Housing Authority - Gary Cooper

Mr. Cooper announced the regular board meeting is scheduled for next Tuesday at 5:30 p.m. He provided an update on the Negotiated Rules Making sessions. He announced the House Financial Services Committee cleared HR 4329 for NAHASDA reauthorization. They will continue to accept college housing applications until the 15th of August. They have been working to realign some of their staff and resources to be more accessible for everyone.

Cherokee Nation Business, LLC - Shawn Slaton

Mr. Slaton reported on the June financial results and stated they contributed an additional \$257,000 to the tribe in terms of tax collections. He gave an update on the health clinic projects, the Roland casino project. Their Cherokee Nation Technology Company was recently award the one acquisition for solution for integrated services. A car show will be held on August 16th at West Siloam Springs. Next week at the Hard Rock the Nancy Ward event will take place. CNI held a month long school drive to assist the students at Peavine Elementary. The ground breaking for the new South Coffeyville casino will be held in the new few weeks. The current job status is 6,005 employees with 4,553 of those being Cherokee. The Cherokee percentage is 74%, other Native American is 7.5% for a total Native American employment of 81.5%. Councilor Cowan Watts inquired about free tickets to the Joint for the Nancy Ward event goes back to the Heritage Center. Councilor Lay inquired if the Cherokee percentage for

the Ramona facility is down recently.
