LEGISLATIVE ACT 43-24

AN ACT AMENDING LEGISLATIVE ACT #34-24 AUTHORIZING THE COMPREHENSIVE OPERATING BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025 - Mod. 3 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CHEROKEE NATION:

SECTION 1. TITLE AND CODIFICATION

This legislative act shall be titled and codified as "An Act Amending Legislative Act #34-24 Authorizing the Comprehensive Operating Budget for FY 2025 – Mod. 3".

SECTION 2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this amendment is to authorize and approve the use of funds, subject to the availability of such funds, in accordance with Section 4, changing the amounts of certain cost centers approved in the "Comprehensive Budget Act for Fiscal Year 2025" or subsequent amendment. The cumulative total of the budget is increased by \$31,891,811 for a total budget authority of \$3,061,376,294. The following items are identified as components of such change:

Grants Received & Authorized per LA 34-24 (detail attached) \$ 31,664,207 227,604 Modification Request (see Section 4 below) Cumulative change in budget authority 31,891,811

SECTION 3. <u>LEGISLATIVE HISTORY</u>

The provisions of compliance, policy of accountability, authorities and severability provided in Legislative Act #34-24 are applicable to this amendment.

SECTION 4. FUNDING AUTHORIZATIONS

The changes reflect increases to cost centers set forth in the program budget justifications incorporated herein. This modification request changes the total amount of the comprehensive budget authorization by an increase of \$ 227,604 to wit:

- A. An increase in the **Tribally Funded** budget authority of \$ 850,000.
- B. An increase in the **Indirect Cost Pool** budget authority of \$ 227,604.
- C. A decrease in the US Department of Treasury budget authority of \$ (850,000).

SECTION 5. PROVISIONS AS CUMULATIVE

The provisions of this Act shall be cumulative to existing law.

SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Act are severable and if any part or provision hereof shall be held void, the decision of the court so holding shall not affect or impair any of the remaining parts or provisions of this Act.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE: EMERGENCY DECLARED

It being immediately necessary for the welfare of the Cherokee Nation, the Council hereby declares that an emergency exists, by reason whereof this Act shall take effect immediately upon its approval and signatures.

SECTION 8. SELF-HELP CONTRIBUTIONS

To the extent that this Act involves programs or services to citizens of the Nation or others, self-help contributions shall be required, unless specifically prohibited by the funding agency, or a waiver is granted due to physical or mental incapacity of the participant to contribute.

Per your request, I have reviewed the administration's budget modification request for this month's Executive & Finance Committee Meeting. Below is a summary of my review:

B. MOD #3 Request - Increase in budget authority - \$ 227,604

- Secretary of State 10102750 Tribally Funded: Modification requesting an increase in expenditure authorization of \$61,664 for increase in activity including 23 photo ID events. The new direct expenditure total is \$665,733. The net expenditure total with IDC and after other income is \$739,170. See my comment in the IDC budget in 5.
- 2. <u>Unappropriated Reserve 10102960 Tribally Funded:</u> Modification requesting a decrease in reserved by appropriation of \$(61,664) to provide the funding for the budget in item 1. The new reserved by appropriation total is \$41,124,426.
- 3. <u>Cattle Operations 10123501 Tribally Funded:</u> New budget requesting expenditure authorization of \$850,000 based on carryover and current cattle sales budget. This moves the original budget from the budget in item 6 (ARPA "American Resue Plan Act" FRP "Fiscal Recovery Plan"). I questioned the large amount in contract services, and it appears that most is for cattle purchases. I requested that they consider reclassifying to a new account or breakout to other accounts as needed for better reporting.
- Indirect Cost Pool Recovery 20400000 Indirect Cost Pool: Modification requesting an increase in IDC Recovery of \$227,604 to cover the cost in budget 5. The new IDC Recovery is \$95,480,596.
- 5. Secretary of State IDC 20412500 Indirect Cost Pool: New budget requesting an increase in expenditure authorization of \$227,604 for increase in activity including 23 photo ID events. The new expenditure total is \$750,152. In general, our administration type budgets are allowed to be included in the Indirect Cost Proposal rate at 50%. Some expenditures are allowable for general fund but are not allowable for indirect costs. Therefore, the general fund budget will always be bigger than the IDC budget. In this case the General Fund budget for Secretary of State has \$665,733 direct expenditures and this IDC budget has \$750,152. Due to time constraints of making the changes and getting the packet mailed out in time, I agreed to have the changes made next month.
- 6. FRF Program Income 37509921 Dept of Treasury: Modification requesting a decrease in expenditure authorization of \$(850,000), decrease in carryover revenue of \$425,000 and decrease in current other revenue of \$425,000 to zero out the budget. The new budget is shown under the new Cattle Operation budget in item 3.

Summary:

After reviewing the submission of the operating modification by the administration, I have no unmentioned technical issues surrounding these requests, nor do I have any unmentioned concerns related to their respective carryover estimates.
