## a.) Accomplishments:

- 1. Sale or Purchase of Land- No property was purchased for the month of December.
- 2. Appraisals- 3 new appraisals were ordered; 15 appraisals were approved.
- 3. Fee-to-Trust/Trust-to-Trust Applications No fee-to-trust applications were sent to BIA this month. Current status on pending Fee-to-Trust/Trust-to-Trust applications:
  - a. Claremore Federal Building is under consideration for formal notice to Cherokee Nation of determined options.
  - b. Morgan Drain- Decision to take into trust received. Updates submitted. Awaiting Deed.
  - c. Chilocco East- Updates submitted.
  - d. 3 IHS clinics- Hastings Hospital, North St. property, and Redbird Clinic fee to trust applications have been returned to Cherokee Nation for future action when transfers to Cherokee Nation by Indian Health Service are complete.
  - e. Kirk Property- Decision to take into trust received. Awaiting Deed. Updates not yet requested.
  - f. Sequoyah Schools- Under consideration for formal notice to Cherokee Nation of determined options.
  - g. Homeland- No Decision received to date. Submitting updates as requested.
  - h. 6 Day Schools- Cave Springs, Oaks Mission School, Ballou School, Mulberry Hollow, Redbird Smith, BIA action under consideration.
- Probates/Quiet Titles- 2 probate inventories were requested and completed. 10 Quiet Title determinations were received and completed. 18 inventories and heirships were requested and completed.
- 5. TAAMS- When the TAAMS project started, there were 12,669 allotments that needed to be researched. During the month of December 2012, we have submitted 46 files to be encoded and have determined that 211 files contain no restricted property. Of the remaining 4,359 files, 198 files are in various stages of review, leaving 4,161 files for status determination.

- 6. Right of Ways, Easements, Right of Entries, and Service Line Agreements- 1 Right of Way approved; 8 right of ways in process; 2 Service line agreements in process; 12 Right of entries prepared.
- 7. Home visits, On-Site Visits, Inspections, Environmental Reviews, Trespass issues- 10 Home visits were conducted. 1 Environmental Review was completed. 40 On-Site Inspections were completed. Trespass issues included 3 boundaries marked and 4 trespass inspections.
- 8. Court appearances/Jurisdictional calls- The Solicitor's Office requested no litigation reports. 24 jurisdictional calls were completed.
- 9. Special Projects Progress-
  - a. ALJ Quota- 2 ALJ's were completed during the month of December.
- 10. Travel/Training- 1 in-house TAAMS training.
- 11. Financial transactions- \$56,781.66 was processed through the lockbox and \$51,220.70 was received in the office for lease payments.

### II. Highlights:

- a) CNEP water staff completed the 2013 Clean Water Quality Assurance Project Plan for FY13. The plan has been submitted to EPA R6 for approval. The plan outlines all the technical and logistical procedures for the Cherokee water sampling events for 2013.
- b) Performed lead-based paint abatement audit at home in Bartlesville. The Cherokee Nation's Housing Rehab Department abatement workers and supervisors are removing lead-based paint on this home before it is remodeled and staff will visit the site to make sure that the rehab crew is certified and using lead-safe work practices to keep both the workers and the home owner safe during the remodeling.
- c) Hastings Hospital- Two bids were submitted for the glycol tank closure. Both bids exceeded the budget so internal alternatives may have to be reassessed to complete this task.
- d) Staff assisted CNEP remediate small areas of contamination after the Outpost #2 convenience store was decommissioned. There were some areas of contamination that were cleaned up and disposed of. This is typical of fueling facility that is being decommissioned.
