WHEREAS, it is always important to recognize the achievements of our Cherokee Nation Citizens who show great skills, accomplishments, and examples for others; and

WHEREAS, Cody William West, a resident of Claremore, Oklahoma, has been a member of the Oklahoma Indian Student Honor Society, the Oklahoma High School Honor Society, and the National Honor Society since 2009; and,


WHEREAS, other High School accomplishments include being a two-time tournament Champion in Vex Robotics, active member of ROTC and many other Claremore High School Activities,


CERTIFICATION




