OFFICE OF CHILD SUPPORT



Child Support:

The Office of Child Support Services has continued to be busy for the month of May. The office distributed 37 requested applications and received 49 new application for new cases. The program recently looked at the increase in numbers for applications received for the time period of Jan 1-May 31, 2018 and the increase has increased by 400% for the same time period in 2017. Also, the following success stories were recorded by casemanagers as the program works to provide quality customer services that are in the best interest of the children and families that are served: 1- Had a Case manager successfully continued to work with an NCP on ensuring regular monthly payments. Another case manager had an NCP successfully pay off all arrears including interest. 3- Had a welcome staff member utilize their personal ability to speak spanish to assist one of our internal clients successfully. The program recently had one employee retire\_Pat Davis after serving the tribal community for almost 30 years. In this same month, unfortunately, the program suffered the loss of one of our newest employees, Jacklyn Hamil. The program staff have been incredible during this time though by continuing to serve our tribal community and making sure the workload continues to be taken care of during this sad time. The program currently has one position open for child support specialist at this time and Hoping to have that position filled in the next 60 days. Will eventually be opening up a couple of other positions in the next 90 days.

This office helps to ensure that tribal facilities are operated in a safe and sanitary manner and provides Tribal members with services and information to lead environmentally healthy lifestyles through inspections and investigations related to food, vectors, water and waste water. This office further provides food service training for certification, environmental disease prevention training, injury prevention intervention, water sampling, and indoor air quality investigations.

## Community Youth Development and Adult Resident Services

### May 2018 Monthly Report

#### **Youth Activities:**

**We held 6 youth activities in May, due to a cancelation because a youth program coordinator resigned at one of our sites and 2 schools did not have Boys & Girls club because school was out. Total attendance at May youth activities was 356 youth, 56 parents/community members & 6 CYD & ARS staff. Not all staff attended each site, 2 – 4 staff members went to each site.**

Cherokee Heights had 2 youth activities in May on Tuesdays, the 1<sup>st</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup>; where they made illustrated a Cherokee cookbook and had a block party with council woman and marshall service. There were 15 - 41 youth at each meeting. There were a total of 56 youth & 4 CYD & ARS staff in attendance.

Tailholt/ Caney had one youth activity scheduled on Monday, May 28<sup>th</sup>, the youth activity was canceled due to the resignation of their youth activity coordinator.

Chewey had 1 youth activity on Tuesday, May 8<sup>th</sup>, where they illustrated a Cherokee cookbook. There were 3 youth, 6 parents & Adult community members & 3 CYD & ARS staff in attendance.

Maryetta Boys & Girls Club had 1 youth activity scheduled on Thursday, May 10<sup>th</sup>, where they illustrated a Cherokee cookbook. There were 17 youth, 3 B&G Club Staff & 4 CYD & ARS staff in attendance.

Cave Springs/Zion Boys & Girls did not have a youth activity in May as school was out and they did not have Boys & Girls Club.

Briggs Boys & Girls club had 1 youth activity scheduled on Wednesday, May 9<sup>th</sup>, where they illustrated a Cherokee cookbook. There were 85 youth, 5 B&G Club staff members and 4 CYD & ARS staff in attendance.

Rocky Mountain Boys & Girls club did not have a youth activity in May as school was out and they did not have Boys & Girls Club.

We also partnered with Kansas Middle School and High School to provide youth activities at their cultural day on Wednesday, May 16<sup>th</sup>, where they made river cane whistles, Miniature gourd masks, clay pinch pots and played stickball. There were 195 youth, 8 school staff and 4 CYC & ARS staff in attendance.

Mailed & handed out 73 copies of flyers about June youth activities to residents, community organizations & participants in Cherokee Heights & Chewey and e-mailed a flyer to Briggs B&G Club & Maryetta B&G club for them to post.

**Adult Resident Activities:**

**We held 9 adult resident activities in May. Total attendance at May Adult resident activities was 47 Adult residents & 6 CYD & ARS staff. Not all staff attended activities at each site, 2-3 staff went to each site.**

Sallisaw/ Tsalagi apartments had 1 Adult Resident Activity on Thursday, May 3<sup>rd</sup>, where they made illustrated a cookbook and brought recipes for the cookbook. There was 1 Adult residents & 4 CYD & ARS staff in attendance. I feel the low attendance was due to the rain and the elders not wanting to get out in the rain.

Chewey Community had 1 Adult Resident Activity on Tuesday, May 8<sup>th</sup>, where they made leather pouches. There were 6 Adult residents & 3 CYD & ARS staff in attendance.

Mailed and handed out 237 copies of flyers about May adult resident activities to housing residents and housing offices in Stilwell, Claremore, Wisdom Keepers, Tahlequah (Leon Daniels, Ross Swimmer and Autumn Heights housing additions), Jay, Vinita, Tsalagi Apartments in Sallisaw, Chewey Community Organization and Lost City Community Organization and e-mailed flyers to Wisdom Keepers, Stilwell Senior Housing, Tahlequah Housing Office, Jay Senior Housing and Tsalagi apartments in Sallisaw to post.

**ADAIR COUNTY PROJECTS:**

1. Bell School South – Windstream was issued a Notice to Proceed with their relocations. A meeting was held May 4<sup>th</sup> with Cherry Tree RWD, it was discovered that a 6” waterline will need to be relocated. This will delay the bridge replacement 90-120 days.
  
2. Honey Hill Phase I –T. McDonald Construction has been awarded the contract. Construction is 90% complete and on schedule at this time. Asphalt is complete and awaiting seed, sodding, signs, and stripe.

**CHEROKEE COUNTY PROJECTS:**

1. Hulbert-Lost City (Grace Huddlen) – Two parcels needed for right-of-way have been submitted to the County Commissioner to condemn for title. Restricted parcels have been submitted to RES.
2. Northeast Fort Gibson- The NEPA process is complete. Cherokee County RWD 1 is nearing completion of the mainline. Muskogee County RWD 7 and HPWA are making service crossings.
3. Ross Street- Construction plans are at 90% stage and have been reviewed by the second level engineer (CGA Engineers). CGA has submitted the Traffic Signal Control Plans to incorporate into our plans. Two remaining parcels needed for right-of-way have been submitted for condemnation. Reviewing final utility relocation plans and bid documents.
4. Dreadfulwater Road – Utility easement corridors were submitted to impacted utility companies for review and approval.

**CRAIG COUNTY PROJECTS:**

1. NS-4340 Road –Craig County RWD #2 has awarded the waterline relocation to Cross-Bo Construction, a start date has not been set.

**DELAWARE COUNTY PROJECTS:**

1. Leach/Kenwood Road – Construction is at 60% complete. Contract liquidated damages began on February 11, 2017. As of April 30, 2018 the number of days have accumulated to 444 days over the contract time at \$1000.00 per day. There is no work being performed.

**MAYES COUNTY PROJECTS:**

**SEQUOYAH COUNTY PROJECTS:**

1. Moonshine Road – A ribbon cutting has been scheduled for June 14<sup>th</sup> at 1:30pm. The ribbon cutting will be at the Zion Holiness Church located by the water tower.

**III. CHEROKEE TRANSIT SYSTEM:**

The application for Federal Transit Administration funds in the amount of \$1,793,972 is in the final stages. This application is for funding requested for FY 2016 (\$934,016) and FY 2017 (\$959,956). These applications were delayed by failed negotiations with the United Keetoowah Band.

Ridership on all routes for the month of April 2018 were:

1. Sallisaw to Tahlequah – 169 rides


## Cultural Outreach & At-Large Communities


