CALL TO ORDER

Chair Austin called the meeting to order at 3:02 p.m.

INVOCATION

Councilor Crittenden gave the invocation.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Councilor Deere moved to approve as submitted. Councilor Patzkowski seconded the motion. The motion carried.

REPORTS:

Cherokee Nation Businesses - Chuck Garrett

Mr. Garrett gave an update on the January financials. He reported on the process of taking over the Gold Strike Hotel and Casino in Tunica. He announced they now have a sixty-five percent Cherokee workforce.

He invited Molly Jarvis and Adrian Sinclair to provide an update on the 1839 Meat Company. Chair Austin inquired as to the source of the meat we currently sell. Councilor Legg requested clarification on the discounts, inquired when they would start processing deer and/or wild hog, the process for a farmer who want to bring in cattle, and the capacity of the facility. Councilor Vazquez inquired as to the length of time to

process and if they will be advertising for the retail sales. Councilor Nofire inquired about potential for growth at the facility. Councilor Smith inquired as to the number of animals that could hang at one time. Councilor Shambaugh inquired about processing bison. Councilor Crittenden inquired about the possibility of other stores and requested clarification on the pricing. Councilor Smith inquired about the hide and heads of the bison.

Mr. Garrett offered to answer questions from his report. Councilor Deere inquired if the employees who have been away from their families to transition the Gold Strike would receive additional compensation or a show of appreciation. Councilor Vazquez inquired if the 1839 Meat Co. merchandise would be available in the gift shops. Councilor Shambaugh inquired about sports betting. Councilor Patzkowski inquired about contact information for 1839 Meat Co. Councilor Smith inquired if there would be sports betting in Tunica.

Financial Report/Treasurer Report - Janees Taylor

Ms. Taylor announced they have received two awards for their financial reporting. They have been giving storm relief payments to our California citizens. She reported on a new way to pay vendors through epay. She offered to answer questions from the report.

Career Services/Employment - Diane Kelley

Ms. Kelley reported on the expansion of the TANF program. They will be combining the Addiction Recovery Program with other programs to help with Department of Justice grants. She spoke of an EDA grant to assist women who are incarcerated. Ms. Kelley gave an update on the nursing grant. She announced they will be weaning participants from the ARPA to the PL102-477 and Quest. She offered to answer questions from the report.

Commerce - Anna Knight

Ms. Knight gave an update on the VITA program and offered to answer questions from the report.
