A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROGRAMS GROUP TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY FOR CLEAN AIR ACT SECTION 103 FUNDING.

WHEREAS, the Cherokee Nation since time immemorial has exercised the sovereign rights of self-government in behalf of the Cherokee people:

WHEREAS, the Cherokee Nation is a federally recognized Indian Nation with a historic and continual government to government relationship with the United States of America;

WHEREAS, the Cherokee Nation has established the Environmental Protection Commission and the Environmental Programs Group to protect public health, welfare and the environment:

WHEREAS, the Cherokee Nation has previously received funding from the EPA Clean Air Act Section 103 Grant Program, with no match required.

WHEREAS, a Clean Air Act Grant will advance the air quality analysis and data collection efforts on tribal land to support future monitoring efforts and protection of public health and the environment.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CHEROKEE NATION, that the Tribal Council hereby authorizes the Environmental Programs Group to submit a formal application to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for a grant under the Clean Air Act Section 103 Grant Program, and that the Principal Chief (or his designee) shall be authorized to conduct contract negotiations and execute all official documents in this regard.

# A RESOLTUION AUTHORIZING THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROGRAMS GROUP TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROCTECTION AGENCY FOR CLEAN AIR SECTION 103 FUNDING

The Cherokee Nation Clean Air Program currently operates five continuous ambient air stations that monitor for criteria pollutant emissions and meteorological data. These sites are located at Tahlequah, Stilwell, Pryor, Roland & Newkirk (Chilocco). Each station monitors for similar parameters which include: Ozone, Carbon Monoxide, Oxides of Nitrogen, Sulfur Dioxides, Particulate Matter (PM2.5 & PM10) and meteorological parameters. The Cherokee Nation also operates several national air program projects in conjunction with federal partners. The projects include the Clean Air Status and Trends Network (CASTNet), Inter-Agency Monitoring of Protected Visual Environments (IMPROVE), Mercury Deposition Network (MDN), and special studies for ambient levels of mercury and ammonia. The CASTNet monitoring program located at the Dahlonegah School in Stilwell evaluates rural ozone; aerosol sulfate, nitrate, and ammonium; gas phase nitric acid and sulfur dioxide; and meteorological variables.
