LEGISLATIVE ACT 22-25

AN ACT AMENDING LEGISLATIVE ACT #34-24 AUTHORIZING THE COMPREHENSIVE OPERATING BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025 - Mod. 11A AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CHEROKEE NATION:

SECTION 1. TITLE AND CODIFICATION

This legislative act shall be titled and codified as "An Act Amending Legislative Act #34-24 Authorizing the Comprehensive Operating Budget for FY 2025 – Mod. 11A".

SECTION 2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this amendment is to authorize and approve the use of funds, subject to the availability of such funds, in accordance with Section 4, changing the amounts of certain cost centers approved in the "Comprehensive Budget Act for Fiscal Year 2025" or subsequent amendment. The cumulative total of the budget is increased by \$ 10,204,687 for a total budget authority of \$3,492,188,522. The following items are identified as components of such change:

Grants Received & Authorized per LA 34-24 (detail attached) 6,321,267 Modification Request (see Section 4 below) 3,883,420 Cumulative change in budget authority 10,204,687

SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

The provisions of compliance, policy of accountability, authorities and severability provided in Legislative Act #34-24 are applicable to this amendment.

SECTION 4. FUNDING AUTHORIZATIONS

The changes reflect increases to cost centers set forth in the program budget justifications incorporated herein. This modification request changes the total amount of the comprehensive budget authorization by an increase of \$3,883,420 to wit:

- A. An increase in the **Tribally Funded** budget authority of \$ 363,405.
- B. An increase in the **Motor Fuel Tax** budget authority of \$ 2,981,987.
- C. An increase in the **Indirect Cost Pool** budget authority of \$ 88,028.
- D. An increase in the **DOI PL 102-477** budget authority of \$ 450,000.

SECTION 5. PROVISIONS AS CUMULATIVE

The provisions of this Act shall be cumulative to existing law.

SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Act are severable and if any part or provision hereof shall be held void, the decision of the court so holding shall not affect or impair any of the remaining parts or provisions of this Act.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE: EMERGENCY DECLARED

It being immediately necessary for the welfare of the Cherokee Nation, the Council hereby declares that an emergency exists, by reason whereof this Act shall take effect immediately upon its approval and signatures.

SECTION 8. SELF-HELP CONTRIBUTIONS

To the extent that this Act involves programs or services to citizens of the Nation or others, self-help contributions shall be required, unless specifically prohibited by the funding agency, or a waiver is granted due to physical or mental incapacity of the participant to contribute.

Per your request, I have reviewed the administration's budget modification request for this month's Executive & Finance Committee Meeting. Below is a summary of my review:

B. MOD #11A Request - Increase in budget authority - \$ 3,883,420

Detention Agreements Gen Fund – 10101540 – Tribally Funded: Modification requesting an increase in expenditure authorization of \$1,700,000. The fiscal year 2025 beginning budget requested was flat to the beginning fiscal year 2024 request and did not account for the late

- year increase. This request reflects the full year rate and one additional detention housing contract. Funding provided by general fund carryover in budget 3. The new budgeted expenditure total is \$8,700,000.
- 2. <u>Concurrent Enrollment 10101770– Tribally Funded:</u> Modification requesting an increase in expenditure authorization of \$123,832 to fund the Fall 2025 semester estimate. Funding provided by general fund carryover in budget 3. The new budgeted expenditure total is \$653,832.
- 3. <u>Unappropriated Reserve 10102960 Tribally Funded:</u> Modification requesting an increase in expenditure authorization of \$2,000,000 for the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority Plate-Pay Implementation payment, an increase in Transfer Out of \$2,981,987 for the Higher Ed Scholarships in budget 7, and a decrease in Reserve by Appropriation of \$(8,805,819). The net change provides funding for budgets in items 1, 2 and 4. The new budget for reserved by appropriation is \$29,043,275.
- 4. <u>Clothing For Kids 10104580– Tribally Funded:</u> Modification requesting an increase in expenditure authorization of \$2,000,000 to fund the Fall 2025 school startup. Funding provided by general fund carryover in budget 3. The new budgeted expenditure total is \$2,270,000.
- 5. <u>Land Development Land Ops 10123500 Tribally Funded:</u> Modification requesting an increase in expenditure authorization of \$7,609. Funding provided by USDA drought assistance money received. The net budgeted expenditure total remains \$1,143,017.
- 6. <u>Cattle Operation 10123501 Tribally Funded:</u> Modification requesting an increase in expenditure authorization of \$5,796. Funding provided by USDA drought assistance money received. The net budgeted expenditure total remains at \$0.
- 7. MVT Higher Ed Scholarships 10240010 Motor Fuel Tax: Modification requesting an increase in expenditure authorization of \$2,981,987 to fund the Fall 2025 semester. Funding provided by transfer in of general fund carryover from budget 3. This budget originated as a Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) budget but the majority of the funding in recent years is Tribally Funded:

- 8. <u>Indirect Cost Pool Recovery 20400000 Indirect Cost Pool:</u> Modification requesting an increase in Indirect Cost Pool Recovery authorization of \$88,028 to fund the increased expenditures in budget 9. The new IDC Recovery revenue is \$96,094,668.
- 9. Cherokee Language Admin 20412440 Indirect Cost Pool: Modification requesting and increase in expenditure authorization of \$88,028. The budget was previously only for salaries/benefits and this mod will add operational costs. The new budgeted expenditure total is \$874,108.

- 10. <u>Youth Shelter Expansion Project 32323030 DOI PL 102-477:</u> New budget requesting expenditure authorization of \$450,000 that is funded from PL 102-477 interest income. This is a supplement to a \$1,000,000 grant from the Department of Justice for this project.
- 11. <u>HJSCA Speaker Services Small Home Repair 10109261 Tribally Funded:</u> New budget requesting expenditure authorization of \$350,000 that is funded from the Housing, Jobs, Sustainable Communities Act (HJSCA). A portion of the allocation that would go the CN Housing Authority is pulled back for the Speaker Services Department to administer the projects for Cherokee speakers that are under \$10,000 per project.

Summary:

After reviewing the submission of the operating modification by the administration, I have no technical issues surrounding these requests, nor do I have any concerns related to their respective carryover estimates. If I can provide any additional information, please do not hesitate to contact me.
