

#### I. Budget Highlights

#### II. Program Highlights

#### a.) Motor Vehicle

- 1. Year to Date Motor Vehicle revenue for FY23 compared to FY22 as of August 31st 2023 & August 31st 2022, had an overall decrease of 1.63%.
- 2. The month to month revenue comparison for August 2022 (FY22) compared to August 2023 (FY23) shows an increase of 0.12%.
- 3. The detail for all areas of revenue for motor vehicle is shown on the attached graphs.
- 4. FY23 new tags issued in the Extended Jurisdictional Boundary for October 725, November 620, December 637, January 652, February 713, March 857, April 708, May 725, June 733, July 702, August 871.

#### b.) Revenue and Taxation Division

- 1. Year to Date Revenue and Taxation (Tobacco) for FY23 compared to FY22 as of August 31st 2023 & August 31st 2022, had an overall increase of 11.69%.
- 2. A month to month revenue comparison for August 2022 (FY22) compared to August 2023 (FY23) shows an increase of 10.66%.
- 3. The detail for all areas of tax is shown on the attached graphs.

#### c.) Future Plans/New Initiatives

- 1. The next Tax Commission meeting is scheduled for December 13, 2023 at 4:30 pm in the CNTC Conference room.
- 2. The Veterans Sales Tax Exemption Cards have been mailed out to all qualified applicants. As of October 4, 2023 we have mailed out 448 Veteran Sales Tax Exemption Cards. CNE has implemented their upgraded system to process the new sales tax exemptions for Cherokee veterans.
- 3. We have received our report for August 2023 purchases and payment from the State of Oklahoma and rebates are scheduled to be distributed to the retailers by or before October 15, 2023.





## RULES COMMITTEE REPORT CHEROKEE NATION GAMING COMMISSION OCTOBER 6, 2023 REPORT

The Cherokee Nation Gaming Commission Commissioners will have a Commission Meeting on October 20, 2023 at the Hard Rock Casino, Catoosa, Oklahoma

The Commissioners deliberate and vote on the issues presented on the Cherokee Nation Gaming Commission Agenda. Several of the items on the Agenda are provided as information only to provide an update to CNGC business and events. The Licensing presented at the September 22, 2023 meeting were as follows;

#### Individual Employee Licenses

#### 1. EMPLOYEES

- Ninety-one (91) Individual Temporary Permits;
- Twenty-six (26) Individual Suitability Determinations;
- Forty-eight (28) Orders
- Twenty-three (23) individual Renewals.

The Licensing Department has received in-house Training from the NIGC on submission of Notice of Results to the NIGC, new Regulations on Key and Primary Management Officials and Virtual Training. Training is required from the Tribal/ State Compact and NIGC. The Licensing Department of the CNGC performs background checks of the potential employee(s) or employee(s) for a Gaming License if the job position requires a Gaming License in accordance with NIGC, Tribal-State Compact, or the Cherokee Nation Tribal Gaming Ordinance before the applicants (employee and vendor) are presented to the Commissioners for a vote at the Gaming Commission Meeting. IF the position is classified KE (key) or PMO (primary management official) fingerprinting and a Criminal history background check is required under NIGC requirements for Licensing. The fingerprinting takes place at ten of the Cherokee Nation Casinos.

#### 2 Companies and Individual Vendors:

- zero (0) Company Orders
- thirty-one (31) Individual Orders
- sixty-seven (67) individual renewals
- seven (7) Company Renewals

In accordance with the Cherokee Nation Gaming Ordinance and the Tribal State

Compact, CNGC establishes and regulates Gaming Vendors. Gaming Vendors are vendors and/or individuals or companies who sell gaming related items,

Cherokee Nation Gaming Commission also discussed;

23 new electronic game themes (17 AGS, 2 Gaming Arts, 1 Velvix, 2 Ainsworth, and 1 Everi)

2 new main program (1 AGS and 1 Everi)

Before being brought to the Commissioners by Compliance Department of the Gaming Commission, the above items are inspected and tested by Gaming Agents.

Other items discussed included two (2) Final Audit Reports, Promotions and Tournaments. The Audit Department also presented the Audit implementation plan for year 2024.
