I. Budget Highlights - April 2010 results

Group: Consolidated CNB

- a. Consolidated Monthly Net Income for all entities of \$6.5M compared to budget of \$8.2M. Consolidated Net Income was below last month by \$3.8M or 37% decrease.
- b. FY10 Year-to-date Consolidated Capex is \$54.3M for all entities.

- a. Total CNE revenue of \$39.6M in April improved 5.2% compared to prior year, but was 7.9% below budget.
 - i. Several properties drove higher revenue in April 2010 compared to April 2009:
 - 1. Tahlequah/Fort Gibson +10.9%
 - 2. Roland/Sallisaw +10.2%
 - 3. West Siloam Springs: +5.74%
 - 4. Catoosa -3.9%
 - 5. Will Rogers Downs -9.0%
 - ii. Highway construction continues to impact revenue at Catoosa
- b. Operating expense for the month was \$30.4M, which was favorable to budget by \$1.6M, or 5.0%. CNE continues to focus on reducing operating costs throughout the company in order to improve profitability.
- c. CNE April 2010 net income totaled \$6.5M, compared to \$7.5M in April 2009. Net income was 20.6% below CNE's budget of \$8.2M.

- a. April revenue totaled \$10.4M, an increase of \$3M or 4% compared to prior year, \$343k or
 3.2% below budget.
 - i. Aerospace and Defense, and Distribution Services represents all of the revenue increase compared to prior year.
- b. Operating expense for the month of \$10.2M was favorable to budget by \$300k, or 3.2%.
- c. CNI April 2010 net income totaled \$70k, compared to a \$330k loss in April 2009. Net income was 7.7% above CNI's budget of \$65k.

- a. April revenue of \$2.43M exceeded March total of \$2.29M.
 - i. 2nd highest monthly revenue in company's 8 month history since acquiring ITX (an IT services government contractor)
 - ii. Current contract backlog over \$30M with \$48M of proposals submitted in the month
 - iii. Two new contracts commencing in March with first full month of new NOAA contract in April
- b. CSG/CNT April net income totaled \$94K, compared to \$156K in the prior month and below monthly averages of \$134K. High cost medical claims and reserves contributed significantly to the monthly shortfall. Year to date net income of \$942K represents 91% of the original business case amount related to the acquisition of ITX.

Group: Other Companies

- a. CN Security and Safety experienced a (\$137k) loss for April. YTD adjustments in April to revenue contributed to the loss. Operating expenses were under budget by \$3.6k. All CNSS activity is related to contract with CNE.
- b. APSE's April 2010 Net Income was \$32k. This is (\$42k) under budget and (\$15k) less than April 2009. YTD net income was \$284k for April 2010. This is (\$225k) under budget and (\$190k) less than April 2009.
- c. CCRC's net income for April was \$120,543. Budgeted net income was a profit of \$182k. The budgeted amount includes \$405k and \$540k in revenue estimated to be generated by the Picatinny and the Dover AFB contracts, respectively. The Picatinny contract actually generated \$468k in revenues in March while the Dover Contract generated only \$174k.

The property has generated \$1.1M to \$1.4M in daily eGames volume through its first 4 days of operation. During that time frame, volume at the Ramona casino exceeded the Tahlequah, Fort Gibson, Sallisaw, and Will Rogers Downs casinos.


b. Notable accomplishments:



- 4. **2010 Northeast Oklahoma Regional Summit** will be held in Tahlequah October 26 and 27. The summit region has been expanded to include all rural counties in the Cherokee Nation and Okmulgee County. At this year's summit the goal is for **regional adoption of an economic growth plan.**

- 5. Collaborating with local partners to complete an **ODOC Work Ready Community certification** process for CN rural counties anticipated completion date 2010. The area has met the high school graduation rates, which is the hurdle we were most concerned about.
- 6. Four trainers, including three artists, are certified to teach the Artists as Entrepreneurs curriculum. This curriculum focuses on building artists' capacity to manage their finances, build their markets, and market their products.
- 7. Seventy youth submitted 38 business plans for the Adair County Youth Entrepreneurship Day that was held April 28, 2010. Youth Adair, Delaware, Sequoyah, and Cherokee Counties participated. Cherokee County Youth Entrepreneur Day was held last fall with 40 youth attending and 20 business plans entered in the competition.

c. Future plans/new initiatives

- 1. Market Place Entrepreneur Program to increase competitiveness of Cherokee owned market place businesses and create strategy to increase market place opportunities (including e-commerce)
- 2. **Bridge to Success Business Mentorship Program** will kick off later this summer. We expect to train mentors in June and begin matching successful business mentors with struggling or new businesses in July and August.
- 3. Certified Indian-owned Business Vendor Fair set for November 9, 2010 at Hard Rock Casino. Muskogee Vendor Fair set for July 21 at Three Rivers Health Clinic.
