

#### a.) Motor Vehicle







The Cherokee Nation Gaming Commission Commissioners will have a Commission Meeting on June 30, 2023 at the Hard Rock Casino, Catoosa, Tahlequah, Oklahoma

The Commissioners deliberate and vote on the issues presented on the Cherokee Nation Gaming Commission Agenda. Several of the items on the Agenda are provided as information only to provide an update to CNGC business and events. The Licensing to be presented at the June 30 2023 meeting will be as follows;

Individual Employee Licenses

#### 1. EMPLOYEES

- Forty-three (43) Individual Temporary Permits;
- Forty-two (42)) Individual Suitability Determinations;
- thirty-two (32) Orders
- Zero (90) individual Renewals.

The Licensing Department of the CNGC performs background checks of the potential employee(s) or employee(s) for a Gaming License if the job position requires a Gaming License in accordance with NIGC, Tribal-State Compact, or the Cherokee Nation Tribal Gaming Ordinance before the applicants (employee and vendor) are presented to the Commissioners for a vote at the Gaming Commission Meeting. IF the position is classified KE (key) or PMO (primary management official) fingerprinting and a Criminal history background check is required under NIGC requirements for Licensing. The fingerprinting takes place at nine of the Cherokee Nation Casinos. Tahlequah Casino employees come to the Water Street location for fingerprinting.

#### 2. Companies and Individual Vendors:

- one (1) Company Orders
- twelve (12) Individual Orders
- zero (2) company renewals
- thirty-one (31) Individual Renewals

In accordance with the Cherokee Nation Gaming Ordinance and the Tribal State Compact, CNGC establishes and regulates Gaming Vendors.

CNGC approved the Facility licenses for the Cherokee Nation Casinos after the annual

inspections based on regulations set forth by the NIGC.

Cherokee Nation Gaming Commission will also discuss new electronic themes, new gaming cabinets, new main programs, new gaming components which consisted of for the Electronic Gaming Machines (EGMs). Before being brought to the Commissioners by Compliance Department of the Gaming Commission, the above items are inspected and tested by Gaming Agents.

Other items to be discussed include Audit Report, Promotions and Tournaments. The Audit Department will present the Audit implementation plan.

Members of the Gaming Commission attended the Sovereignty Symposium in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.
