II. Program Highlights

a.) Motor Vehicle

- 1. Year to Date Motor Vehicle revenue for FY20 compared to FY19 as of July 31st 2020 & July 31st 2019, had an overall increase of 3.64%.
- 2. The month to month revenue comparison for July 2019 (FY19) compared to July 2020 (FY20) shows an increase of 16.31%.
- 3. The detail for all areas of revenue for motor vehicle is shown on the attached graphs.

- 3. We have received our report for July 2020 purchases and payment from the State of Oklahoma and rebates are scheduled to be distributed to the retailers by or before September 15, 2020.
