



Ambulatory Care Visits Month of November 2018-2022




<u>Dental Services</u> <u>Month of November 2019-2022</u>




No. of Rx filled Month of November 2019-2022





CHS Monthly Referrals by Location




YTD CHS Spend by Location



Patient Visits and Revenue


Ambulatory Care Visits: Monthly




Ambulatory Care 3rd Party Revenue: Year to Date




Third Party Revenues Combined: Year to Date





Working Together Initiative:

In 2021, Cherokee Nation Public Health (CNPH) launched *Working Together*, an initiative to bring partners together across Cherokee Nation to better understand and address the multiple social, cultural, economic, and environmental conditions that influence Cherokee well-being. Over a 12-month period, CNPH held engagement meetings with more than 50 representatives across multiple departments, including but not limited to, Education, Language and Culture, Human Services, Environmental Health, school and community health programs, and local and state health departments. A Working Together Team was then formed to review engagement outcomes, and to work towards the following goals:

Create a shared vision for Cherokee Wellness

Create a wellness framework reflective of the social and cultural determinants of health. Identify indicators to determine how wellness will be measured.

Using a method called Results Based Accountability, the Working Together Team worked collaboratively to define the desired "results" or aspirations for Cherokee wellness. The Team explored the many *social and cultural determinants* that can affect community and individual wellness. Social determinants include social, cultural, economic, and environmental factors and conditions that affect the ability of individuals, families and entire communities to make choices that promote good health. The Team considered education, economic stability, safe and affordable housing, built and natural environments, access to quality healthcare, cultural and community connectedness, and exposure to trauma.

In 2023, we will begin phase 2 of the project which includes finalization of Cherokee Indicators of Wellness, expanded inclusion of staff from additional programs, and initial collaborative data collection and evaluation.

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Tribal Advisory Committee (TAC):

TAC Chair Deputy Chief Warner and Authorized Representative Lisa Pivec continue work with CN Government Relations staff to provide input to CDC. The Winter TAC meeting will be held at CDC headquarters in Atlanta, GA in February, 2023. TAC meeting planning is in progress and the TAC Chair Deputy Chief Warner leads those efforts in conjunction with CDC staff.

National Association of City County Health Officials (NACCHO):

O Cherokee Nation Public Health Interim Executive Director, Lisa Pivec, was elected to the Board of Directors representing Tribal Public Health Departments. NACCHO is the only organization dedicated to serving every local health department in the nation. NACCHO serves 3000 local health departments and is the leader in providing cutting-edge, skill-building, professional resources and programs, seeking health equity, and supporting effective local public health practice and systems. Ms. Pivec was elected recently to serve on the governance committee of NACCHO.
