



The Cherokee Nation Gaming Commission Commissioners held a Commission Meeting on February 10, 2023 at the Hard Rock Casino in Catoosa, Oklahoma.

The Commissioners deliberate and vote on the issues presented on the Cherokee Nation Gaming Commission Agenda. Several of the items on the Agenda are provided as information only to provide an update to CNGC business and events. The items heard during the February 2023 meeting were as follows;

Individual Employee Licenses

#### 1. EMPLOYEES

- Forty-eight (48) Individual Temporary Permits;
- Fifty-one (51)) Individual Suitability Determinations;
- Sixty-three (63) Orders

The Licensing Department of the CNGC performs background checks of the potential employee(s) or employee(s) for a Gaming License if the job position requires a Gaming License in accordance with NIGC, Tribal-State Compact, or the Cherokee Nation Tribal Gaming Ordinance before the applicants (employee and vendor) are presented to the Commissioners for a vote at the Gaming Commission Meeting. If the position is classified KE (key) or PMO (primary management official) fingerprinting and a Criminal history background check is required under NIGC requirements for Licensing. The fingerprinting takes place at nine of the Cherokee Nation Casinos. Tahlequah Casino employees come to the Water Street location for fingerprinting.

In accordance with the Cherokee Nation Gaming Ordinance and the Tribal State Compact, CNGC establishes and regulates Gaming Vendors.


CNGC approved the Facility licenses for the Cherokee Nation Casinos after the annual
