II. Program Highlights

a.) Motor Vehicle

- 1. Year to Date Motor Vehicle revenue for FY16 compared to FY15 as of December 31st 2015 & December 31st 2014, had an overall increase of 14.27%.
- 2. The month to month revenue comparison for December 2014 (FY15) compared to December 2015 (FY16) shows an increase of 3.82%.



Description of Budget exceptions: No budget exceptions to report. All three of the Self Governance Analyst positions are vacant.

II. Program Highlights

1. Arkansas Riverbed Authority Budget Update:

The Arkansas Riverbed Authority Budget updates were finalized for FY 2015 4th quarter and the 2016 1st quarter. On January 7, 2016, Self-Governance Interim Director met with the Arkansas Riverbed Authority at their quarterly meeting held during the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes meeting and presented these financial reports.

2. First Quarter FY2016 GPRA/TDE Submission:

Self-Governance in coordination with Human Services, HIP Coordinator, and Finance collected and submitted GPRA data for input in the Tribal Data Exchange (TDE). The TDE is a pilot program funded through the Tribal Interior Budget Committee. The TDE collects information relative to a variety of regulatory reports. As a part of the pilot, the Nation submits information on two GPRA measures. (Social Services Individual Self Sufficiency Plans and HIP progress reports)

3. 2018 BIA Budget Formulation

Self-Governance Interim Director assisted the Director of Finance and Controller in the preparation and submission of the Nation's FY 2018 Budget Formulation package to the BIA Regional Office. The annual budget meeting with Tribal Leaders within the Eastern Oklahoma Region will be held Thursday, February 4, 2016. The Region will compile all the information provided by the Tribes and present a consolidated report on the unfunded obligations within the Region at the March Tribal Interior Budget Committee meeting.

4 Indian Health Service Contract Support Cost Workgroup Meeting:

On January 29, 2016, Self-Governance Interim Director attended and participated in the IHS Contract Support Cost (CSC) Workgroup meeting. The purpose of the meeting was to continue the process of updating IHS policies. The two main topics of discussion involved determination of duplicative funding and alternative methods for calculating Indirect Cost funding associated with Tribal shares.

5. Ramah Contract Support Cost Settlement update:

On January 20, 2016 a federal judge held a fairness hearing for the \$940 million Ramah Navajo Contract Support Costs settlement. The judge approved the settlement which clears the way for Tribes and tribal organizations to receive their shares for self-determination underpayments from the BIA. The Tribes will share in \$854.6 million, the amount remaining after \$79.9 million in attorney fees and \$5.5 million in other costs are deducted.

III. Negotiations:

• DOI, OST Negotiations:

The Self-Governance Interim Director met with OST Administrator to reengage in discussions with the DOI Office of Special Trustee to renegotiate our Real Estate Appraisal Services and Beneficiary Processes Program Memorandums of Understanding.
