Cherokee Nation Office of Child Support Services continues to provide establishment& enforcement services and as of this past month have now had dockets in every county within the 14 county jurisdiction, absent McIntosh. The program is currently down one attorney, so the one Assistant Attorney General assigned to Child Support has been incredibly busy. It is exciting to see application requests up considerably. Some of the office staff went to 4 clothing voucher sites to provide information about our services and that was met positively by the people they came in contact with. The program recently celebrated 10 years of providing services and because of this office, there are many families who have received child support on an average of 4.25 million each year for the past 5 years.







- 1. Bell North Red Plains sent final exhibits on June 21, 2017.
- 2. Bell School South Design is complete. Acquisition has begun. NEPA is complete.
- 3. Bidding Springs Road Aerials have been received to begin design. Survey is currently in progress.
- 4. Bunch Road Held meeting with Engineer. Decided to design a 4-span bridge to replace low water crossing.
- 5. Chewey Road NEPA is completed. The firm of Smith-Roberts will start there acquisition process after appraisals are complete.
- 6. Dahlonegah South NEPA has been completed. The firm of Smith-Roberts started the acquisition process November 1, 2016. Four parcels out of 22 parcels have been acquired.
- Dahlonegah West- Holloway Updike and Bellen Engineers working on 60% plans.
- 8. Honey Hill Phase I Prebid meeting is scheduled for August 24, 2017. The bid opening will be September 7, 2017.
- 9. Lyon South Road Design is at 60% stage. Holloway Updike and Bellen Engineers are finalizing H&H.
- 10. Lyon Switch Road Design is working on 90% plans.
- 11. Malloy Hollow—Design is working with environmental services to supply information needed for the 404 application. Received preliminary relocation plans from Ozark Electric and attended Cherry Tree RWD board meeting to discuss the need to relocate the existing waterline. Final plans completed. Utility easements and R/W acquisition to begin when R/W department available.
- 12. North Salem (Bethel Road) Red Plains is revising the exhibits and easements.
- 13. Rocky Mountain School Loop Bridge Design complete. Waiting on 404 permit for NEPA to be approved.
- 14. Sally Bull Hollow Awaiting the level III archeological report so we will know how to proceed in design.
- 15. Smith Hollow Red Plains is revising the utility exhibits and easements.

COMMUNITY SERVICES COMMITTEE REPORT

### **CHEROKEE COUNTY PROJECTS:**

- 1. Hulbert-Lost City (Grace Huddlen) –Right of Way is currently at 78% (32 parcels out of 41 acquired). Five of the remaining parcels are Restricted Indian Land and r/w packets were submitted to RES on 5/22/2017.
- 2. Mud Valley Road Aerial data has been received and submitted to Guy Engineering for design.
- 3. Northeast Fort Gibson- The NEPA process is complete. Utilities are in the process of being relocated.
- 4. Ross Street-Monthly meeting for Engineering and Utility Coordination will be held on May 23, 2017 at 10 a.m. Identified utility companies along the project as LREC, AT&T, TPWA, and NOPFA. OG&E easement conflicts with roadway easement. Meeting is scheduled for June 6 at 1:30 p.m. to hopefully resolve the issue. Agreement between Cherokee Nation and the City of Tahlequah is in the Contracts Department for final review before delivering it to the City for signatures. Utility corridors have been approved by each of the utility companies. Awaiting final relocation plans from each utility. Construction plans are at 90% stage and are being reviewed by the second level engineer (CGA Engineers). CGA is also working on the traffic signaling plans which have been submitted to ODOT for their review. Guy Engineering will be acquiring the right of way on this project. They are currently preparing the r/w documents and securing appraisals.
- 5. Tenkiller School Construction is -100% complete. Project contract currently in liquidated damages. Final estimate quantities being discussed.

### **CRAIG COUNTY PROJECTS:**

1. NS-4340 Road – Right of Way sent AT&T's packet to Real Estate Services October 22, 2016. All remaining utility easement applications on Trust Lands were submitted to the BIA for approval on 6/12/2017. Additional corporation documents were requested by the BIA for PSO. 7/11/2017 BIA approved the AT&T utility easements that cross CN Trust Land & Jerline Chisholm Brown Trust Land.

### **DELAWARE COUNTY PROJECTS:**

- 1. Leach/Kenwood Road Clearing is completed. Construction is 44.4% complete. Contrac liquidated damages began on February 11, 2017.
- 2. Kansas/Dry Creek Holloway Updike & Bellen completed all ownership changes and submitted updated easements and exhibits on 7/18/2017. Appraiser is finishing appraisals. Right of Way is preparing parcel folders to begin r/w acquisition in the next few months

### **MUSKOGEE COUNTY PROJECTS:**

### COMMUNITY SERVICES COMMITTEE REPORT

- 1. Northeast Fort Gibson- Utility relocation is moving forward.
- 2. Texanna Road Survey has been processed. Pavement borings being performed. Preliminary design underway. Right of Way is completing title research for all property owners.

### **SEQUOYAH COUNTY PROJECTS:**

- Dwight Mission/Sequoyah Landing Road A preconstruction meeting has been scheduled for June 27<sup>th</sup> with awarded contractor JOB Construction. This project has a fixed completion date of July 31, 2017. September 15 currently under conctruction 55%
- 2. Moonshine Road Four bids were received with Glover coming in the lowest at \$2,460,090.71 with a completion date of December 15, 2017

### WASHINGTON COUNTY PROJECTS:

 Matoka Bridge (Br. #84) — Awarded to H&H Bridge Company, construction begins April 3, 2017 and is scheduled to be completed by July 21, 2017 Cherokee Nation contributed \$700,370.24 to Washington county as per the agreement between Cherokee Nation and Washington county.

### III. CHEROKEE TRANSIT SYSTEM:

There are currently two van orders: order #1 – two bi-fuel conversion vans. This delivery has been delayed due to a Ford recall. There is no current estimated delivery date. Bids for 6 additional gasoline vans were received with John Vance Auto being the lowest bidder. Estimated time of delivery is November 29, 2017. One van order has been completed with the van being tagged and picked up by KATS. This van will travel the Stilwell to Tahlequah route and the replaced bus will be used on the Tahlequah to Catoosa route.





### MAP Household Averages Household income \$37,866.85 Home Price \$105,765.71




The Mortgage Assistance Program has implemented its prioritization policy. The number of eligible applicants exceeds the amount of funding available so until the end of the fiscal year, families who have previously owned a stick built home or a mobile home at any point in the past will not receive down payment assistance funds until after October 1, 2017. Families who have participated in self sufficiency counseling for at least 3 months will be exempt from the previous home ownership stipulation.




419 families are actively saving in iSave for home rehabilitation or home purchase. iSave is  $\alpha$  matched savings program wherein income eligible families save a certain amount of money over a period of time and the iSave program matches the families' savings to build financial assets.

Families purchasing a home must attend an intensive **homeownership training** class. Year to date **445 families have attended these classes**, which are held throughout the Cherokee Nation.

Citizens, Cherokee Nation employees and CNB employees have the opportunity to attend financial education classes on topics ranging from spending plans, balancing checkbooks and couponing. Year to date 4,202 people have attended community and work based financial education classes.



## TO THE PARTY AND THE PROPERTY OF THE PROPERTY

## OCAPS: Out-Of-District Court Advocacy and Permanency Services

- Involved in child welfare cases in non-jurisdiction counties in Oklahoma and all 50
- Most work is done telephonically or electronically.
- Emphasis on education about the Indian Child Welfare Act and ensuring States comply with it.

## SCAPS: State Court Advocacy and Permanency Services

a

- Involved in child welfare cases inside the 14 counties of which all or part are within the jurisdiction of the Nation.
- Emphasis on education about the Indian Child Welfare Act and ensuring OKDHS compliance, and sometimes provide Tribal Foster Homes.
- Provides services to the families when OKDHS fails to do so or as an alternative to OK DHS services.

## TCAPS: Tribal Court Advocacy and Permanency Services

- Involved in child welfare cases which are wholly under the jurisdiction of the Nation and OKDHS is not involved.
- These cases originate on Indian Country or are transferred in from State district courts. Hearings are held at our Tribal Court House. Tribal Foster Homes are fully utilized.

### GPA: Guardianships and Private Adoptions


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
- Involved in voluntary adoptions when the birth parents wish to place their child for adoption.
- Monitors Guardianships and Private Adoptions for compliance with the Indian Child Welfare Act and the best interests of children.
- Serves Cherokee children and their families in Tribal Court and parts of Oklahoma.


### CPS: Child Protective Services

- a Receives referrals involving allegations of maltreatment of Cherokee children.
- It Investigates allegations of child maltreatment in Indian Country and coinvestigates with DHS in some counties when Cherokee children are involved.

## Efficient & Effective Work

### **Eligibility Notices**

When a County or State's child welfare agency gets involved in the life of a family that they suspect to be Cherokee, they're required by the Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA) to send Notice to the tribe. The tribe must then reply to confirm or deny whether the children are members of (or eligible to become members of) the tribe. The tribe has 30 days to respond.

### Month of July

Cherokee Nation received:

- State of Oklahoma 531 notices involving 851 children
- Outside of Oklahoma 744 notices for 1,089 children.
- Totaling 1,275 children and 1,940 notices.
- □ The longest Response-to-Notice time this month was 137 days.

## Prevention and Intervention

Indian Child Welfare Family Protection Services
Unit (FPS) assists families in need of hands-on
training to correct the conditions that lead to
children being removed from their home. These
services often include completing a 28 week
parenting program that discusses topics like
discipline, nutrition, budgeting, and
housekeeping. We primarily assist all our tribal
CAPS cases but can assist in State cases when a
request is made. This helps insure that families
have the tools they need to be reunited. We
have also added Triple P Parenting curriculum to
our program this year.

### Month of July

FPS served 43 children and 25 families.






## Types of Certified Placement Resource Homes

- Non-Relative Adoptive: Families who hope to adopt children when the children's parents' rights are terminated. These homes do not take foster placements.
- Non-Relative Fost/Adopt: Families who take foster placement of children knowing their parental rights are not terminated and they could return home, but if they don't the placement family will have the first chance to adopt them.
- Non-Relative Foster: Families who are willing to take in children they do not know on a temporary basis, but may last years. These families usually do not adopt children.
- Relative Adoptive/Foster: Families who are related to the children and are fostering them or planning to adopt them. They do not take in children they are not related to.
- Emergency/Respite: Families that take very short-term placement of children while more permanent placements are sought or when only a short-term placement is needed.

### Certification Homes by Type

- 192 Total Homes note many are in multiple categories
  - 12 Non-Relative Foster Only Homes
    - 37 Relative Foster and Adoptive
- 113 Non-Relative Fost/Adopt, Non-Relative Adoptive
  - 27 Adoptive Only Home
