## **AMBULATORY CARE VISITS** by Health Centers, April 2016-2018




## TOTAL AMBULATORY PATIENTS VISITS April 2016- 2018




### No. of RX filled by health facility April 2018





## **Dental Services Trend April 2016-2018**






## Third Party Revenue by Health Centers Thru March 2016- March 2018( Based on Year to-date Collections)







## Total Third Party Revenue Comparison (Health Centers/Dental services only Based on Year to-date Collections)

#### **Ambulatory Care Services Report for Health Centers**

- AMO Health Center (AHC): 23 new charts. Tonya Swim, Dietician, received the Dietitian of the Year award
  from the Oklahoma Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics. Two new employees joined the staff, James Collier Clinic Caretaker and Tamisha Harmon Clerk III in Medical Records. Julie Gaskins, APRN completed the 26
  mile "Run to Remember" OKC Memorial Marathon.
- Cooweescoowee Health Center (CHC): 66 new/reactivated charts. Four new employees joined the staff: Donna Bynum RN, Jennifer Adair MIR, Emil Russell Clerk III, and Dakota Hines Clinic Caretaker.
- Three Rivers Health Center (TRHC): 104 new charts. Employees of the Month: Tyann Marshall and Kiesha Poafpybitty.
- Will Rogers Health Center (WRHC): 31 new charts. Hosted a health fair in South Coffeyville. Dietitians taught South Coffeyville 5<sup>th</sup> graders nutrition education. Presented smoking cessation education at the Nowata County Senior Health Fair. Taught 10 senior high school students CPR. Blood pressure checks in Lenapah, Senior Advantage in Bartlesville Delaware Tribe, and Nowata Seniors.

#### Cherokee Nation W.W. Hastings Hospital

#### Achievements

Christy Logsdon, formerly a phlebotomist at Hastings, has completed the Medical Laboratory Technician (MLT) training program offered by NEO A&M in Miami via their MLT Distance Program. Christy was able to complete her clinical rotations for the training at WWH and has started her orientation so she can now serve as a MLT at WWH.

#### Patient Access

Labor and Delivery delivered 79 babies during April 2018. The Emergency Department and Urgent Care provided care to 5,501 patients during April 2018 with a Left Without Being Seen (LWOBS) rate of 4.3%. Surgical Services performed 442 surgical procedures during April 2018.

- Dental Services: Clinical visits include Exams, Emergency Exams, Return Visits for Treatment, Diabetic Screenings, and HeadStart Screenings: 7,147 clients served. Scheduled Dental Examinations for routine care: 2,587 clients were served. Emergency Exams (these are unscheduled walk in patients): 1,010 clients were served.
- Comprehensive Cancer Control Program— is a CDC funded cancer prevention program with an emphasis on surveillance and public education to raise awareness about cancer. They are currently focusing on prevention of liver cancer and HPV risks and prevention education.
- Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program The program serve Indian/Cherokee women (Clinical Breast Exam, Mammograms, Ultrasound, Pap smear, HPV testing, Colposcopy with or without biopsy, Colposcopy w/ ECC and ECC, and Cytopathology). The program screened 1,448 for Breast Cancer patients, and 1,185 for Cervical Cancer patients during FY-2018.
- Behavioral Health Service—A range of behavioral health Services were provided to 1,860 clients across 2,508 visits to Behavioral Health in April, 2018. The services provided ranged from initial treatment intakes to psychiatric services to rigorous psychological assessments to parent-child interaction therapy and include animal-assisted, individual, group, and marriage and family therapy.
- Dietary Services 830 clients were provided dietary counseling services. Services include DSME Classes; DM Classes; Weight Mgmt. Classes; Employee Activity Committee Activities; DM Ancillary Clinic; Lunch and Learn; Healthy Native Program-Nutrition Lessons; Employee Wellness Wt. Challenge; Maintain Don't Gain

- Challenge. Classes/Presentations: 40 participants. Worksite or Community Classes/Presentations: 110 participants.
- Emergency Medical Services—the program served 484 clients; of those 343 were routine transport and 12 were emergency transports. In addition 784 participants were trained at our facility.
- Public Health Nursing @ Claremore- PHN's provided 96 Home Visits/postpartum checkup, 1,192 clinic screenings/classes, and 604 phone call/audits/letters.
- Public Health Nursing @ Hastings- PHN's provided 106 Home Visits, 169 clinic screenings/classes, and 396 phone call/audits/letters.
- Staffing Report- Total positions: 2,453; of these 2,206 (89.3%) are filled, 247 (11%) are vacant.
- Contract Health Services—During the month of April 2018, CHS program processed 10,931 referrals of those 10,752 (98.36%) were approved at the cost of \$ 4,290,923
- Health facilities Completed 87% of 272 preventive maintenance. Completed 107 of 120 called in work orders.
   Completed 100% of property work orders. Developed two Infection Control Risk Assessments (ICRA) at Vinita Health Center ultra-sound room and primary care. Performed a pre-construction assessment at Will Rogers Health Center.
- Diabetes Services—The 454 diabetic patients were provided DSME or other diabetes-related classes by a RN/Pharmacist. 427 patients received nutrition education from a RD. \$26,253 has been spent to purchase DM shoes, Year to date 2018 and 127 patients have received Diabetic shoes.

#### Public Health Monthly Report -April 2017

- Community Recreation Center-Total Members: 11,980; Active Wings club members 8,275.
- Cherokee Nation Health Survey—OU Health Sciences Center is continuing their phone survey. To date we have had over 3,400 responses to the survey with a goal of 4,000 completed surveys. We are working closely with OU to get the survey completed and the data analyzed.
- Public Health Educators—The Public health educators works directly with Cherokee communities as well as schools located within our jurisdiction. They are engaged in promoting, hosting and supporting, physical activities, Smoking cessation classes, Healthy Native living Classes. The PHE continues to facilitate Healthy Native Diabetes Prevention classes held at the Healthy Living Campus, Running/Walking clubs, programs like, "RETHINK YOUR DRINK", Farmers Market, Cultural Presentation to the Boys and Girls Club of Mayes County, they walked with 40 + after school students at the Salina Elementary track. PHEs in Adair "Between a Walk and hard Place"- Our 22 participants did their monthly weigh in for the month of April as a group they have lost a total of 262.5 pounds and are averaging 10,000 steps a day.
