- Cherokee Nation's Male Seminary Recreation Center celebrated 10 years of service to the Cherokee people.




CNHS Provider Vacancy Rate


## Referral Approval Rate



**Monthly Visits by Location** 



### YTD CHS Spend by Location




## Patient Visits and Revenue


#### **Ambulatory Care Visits: Monthly**




#### **Ambulatory Care Revenue YTD**




#### Health Center and Dental Revenue Year to Date













### **WWH Inpatient Care**
