

The Office of Real Estate Services is responsible for administering the laws, regulations, and policies affecting the protection and management of the trust and restricted lands of individual Indian landowners and the land owned by the Cherokee Nation itself, located within the 14 county area of the Cherokee Nation. Real Estate Services is operated under a Self-Governance Compact with the Secretary of the Interior.

- II. Program Highlights:
- 1. Land acquisitions. One 140 acre tract purchased January 22, 2020.

- 2. Fee to Trust. During the 2019 calendar year, 463 acres were put into trust status.
- 3. <u>Leases</u>. One tribal grazing lease was submitted and approved; two restricted agriculture leases were approved; one restricted hunting lease was submitted and approved during the month of December.
- 4. Appraisals. Nine appraisals were ordered and received.
- 5. <u>Environmental Reviews</u>. Seven environmental reviews were requested and three were received; four pending.
- 6. <u>Inventory/Heirships.</u> Eight Inventory/Heirships were requested, completed and returned.
- 7. Report for Distributions. 16 RFDs were requested, processed and returned.
- 8. Quiet Titles. Three quiet title notices were received, researched and returned.
- 9. <u>Last Will and Testaments</u>. Two LW&Ts were prepared and endorsed; one District Court approval was completed; eight interviews were taken and four drafts prepared to date.
- 10. <u>Rights of Entry</u>, <u>Service Line Agreements</u>. 10 rights of entry were requested and prepared; one service line agreement is pending.
- 11. On-Site Inspections, Home Visits, Trespass issues. 13 on-site inspections were requested and completed. One home visit was completed. Four trespass issues were reported and addressed.
- 12. Maps/platting. 22 requests for maps/platting assistance were received and completed.
- 13. <u>Jurisdictional calls</u>. 74 jurisdictional calls were completed during the month, with 31 after hours.
- 14. <u>District Court Probates.</u> All new probate applications are being researched in preparation for filing in District Court.
- 15. Stats. 107 client sign-ins (walk-ins), 91 phone inquiries, 43 obituaries were processed.
- 16. <u>Financial transactions.</u> During the month of January, \$315,397.09 processed through the lockbox and \$23,608.89 processed as lease payments.
- 17. <u>TAAMS</u>. Two staffers continue to encode into the Trust Asset and Accounting Management System (TAAMS) at the BIA-EORO three days each week. Additional staff is performing final review and updates.
- 18. Impact Aid. 16 impact aid verifications were processed during the month.

National Zinc

The United States Department of Justice filed the Complaint for this NRDA Case in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Oklahoma. The Public Comment Period has been added to the Federal Register Notice and is currently undergoing public comment until February 8th.

Brownfields

Staff started working on the Phase I ESA for the Mission Park Project Phase. Staff has ordered the environmental data report (EDR) and conducted a site reconnaissance.

Realty:

- Staff finalized the Will Rogers Complex Phase I environmental site assessment (ESA) and was completed for Cherokee Nation Real Estate Services as part of the trust acquisition package.
