





## NATURAL RESOURCE DAMAGE ASSESSMENT AND RESTORATION (NRDAR)

Tar Creek

Staff worked on NRDA Competitive Projects Budgets and submitted a 2 Year Restoration Proposal to the Lead Administrative Trustee for the Tar Creek Trustee Council.

Tulsa County Smelter Complex

Staff is working with State of Oklahoma and US Fish and Wildlife State on the Electronic and paper resources for this NRDA Project. Information will be submitted electronically to the new Trustee Council Consultant.

## Cherokee Nation Realty:

Staff completed the Environmental Summary for Demaree Property in Sequoyah County. The summary included Environmental Data Resources (EDR) historical topographic maps, aerial maps and the Corridor Reports were received with data base findings. The boundaries for the Demaree Property were incorrect for the EDR Corridor Report. Staff contacted, Greg Holt with EDR to inform him of the error. An edited EDR Corridor Report was sent with the correct boundaries. A second site recon was conducted to take additional aerial pictures with the drone. A map was printed with the EPA Envirofacts findings. A wetland and FEMA floodplain map were formatted and were included in the report. The complete Environmental Summary Report was submitted to Cherokee Nation Real Estate Services. The historical topographic and aerial maps were sent to Brad Asbill for maps to be formatted with the property boundary. The Phase I ESA is being conducted for Cherokee Nation Real Estate Services for due diligence for purchase of property.
