COUNCIL OF THE CHEROKEE NATION

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF LAND IN TRUST-
BALLOU DAY SCHOOL 10 ACRES, CAVE SPRINGS (DRY CREEK) DAY SCHOOL
10 ACRES, MULBERRY HOLLOW DAY SCHOOL 18.73 ACRES, OAK HILL (PINEY)
DAY SCHOOL 10 ACRES, OAKS MISSION (ROCKY FORD) DAY SCHOOL 5.0
ACRES AND REDBIRD SMITH DAY SCHOOL 40 ACRES.**

WHEREAS, the Cherokee Nation since time immemorial has exercised the sovereign rights of self-government in behalf of the Cherokee people;

WHEREAS, the Cherokee Nation is a federally recognized Indian Nation with a historic and continual government to government relationship with the United States of America;

WHEREAS, Cherokee Nation authorizes the acceptance in Trust for Cherokee Nation of tracts of land identified as follows: Ballou Day School in Mayes County, Cave Springs (aka Dry Creek) Day School in Cherokee County, Mulberry Hollow Day School in Adair County, Oak Hill (aka Piney) Day School in Delaware County, Oaks Mission (aka Rocky Ford) Day School in Cherokee County, and Redbird Smith Day School in Sequoyah County. The above listed Day Schools have been determined by Eastern Oklahoma Region, Bureau of Indian Affairs, United States Department of the Interior, to be eligible for transfer to United States of America in Trust for Cherokee Nation under 40 U.S.C. §523 (a). The former day school properties are further described as follows:

Ballou Day School

THENCE, due North along the sixth Guide Meridian 800 feet;
THENCE, North 89° 53' East 394 feet;
THENCE, due South 800 feet to the section line;
THENCE, South 89° 53' West along the section line 394 feet to the Point of Beginning, Containing a total of 7 acres, more or less;

Oak Hill (aka Piney) Day School

Township 22 North, Range 24 East, Delaware County, I.B.&M;

Section 15 NE4 SE4 SW4, Containing 10 acres, more or less;

Oaks Mission (aka Rocky Ford) Day School

Township 19 North, Range 22 East, Cherokee County, I.B.&M;

Section 12 N2 NW4 SE4 NE4, Containing 5 acres, more or less;

Redbird Smith Day School

Township 13 North, Range 22 East, Sequoyah County, I.B.&M;


Section 30 SW4 SE4, Containing 40 acres, more or less.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the United States of America is formally requested to transfer the above described six (6) Day Schools to United States of America in Trust for Cherokee Nation.


BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CHEROKEE NATION, that the Principal Chief of Cherokee Nation, Chuck Hoskin, Jr., and/or his authorized designee(s) be authorized to accept from the Secretary of the Interior said tracts of land in Trust for Cherokee Nation in accordance with Bureau of Indian Affairs policy and procedure for the acquisition of land.

CERTIFICATION

The foregoing resolution was adopted by the Council of the Cherokee Nation at a duly called meeting on the 12th day of October, 2021, having 17 members present, constituting a quorum, by the vote of 17 yea; 0 nay; 0 abstaining.

This Resolution provides authorization to accept Ballou Day School in Mayes County, Cave Springs (aka Dry Creek) Day School in Cherokee County, Mulberry Hollow Day School in Adair County, Oak Hill (aka Piney) Day School in Delaware County, Oaks Mission (aka Rocky Ford) Day School in Cherokee County, and Redbird Smith Day School in Sequoyah County for United States of America in Trust for Cherokee Nation.

The six Day Schools are currently owned by the United States of America. The Bureau of Indian Affairs is requested to transfer in Trust status to United States of America in Trust for Cherokee Nation the properties described as follows:

1. Ballou Day School 10 acres in Mayes County.
2. Cave Springs (aka Dry Creek) Day School 10 acres in Cherokee County.
3. Mulberry Hollow Day School 18.73 acres in Adair County.
4. Oak Hill (aka Piney) Day School 10 acres in Delaware County.
5. Oaks Mission (aka Rocky Ford) Day School 5 acres in Cherokee County.
6. Redbird Smith Day School 40 acres in Sequoyah County.
