Councilor Baker moved to approve the May 14, 2012 regular session minutes. Councilor Fishinghawk seconded the motion. The motion carried.

STATE OF THE NATION

Bill John Baker Principal Chief

Chief Baker announced they recently held the grand opening for the Nowata Food Distribution Center and Nutrition sight. He reported they just received the approval for a special deputization at the Claremore Indian Hospital for our Marshals. Marshal Casey King has been cross-deputized with the U.S. Marshal Service with complete jurisdiction and has been invited to be part of the Major Crimes Task Force. They are working to acquire cross-deputization for Sequoyah High School as well. He reported we now have seven food distribution sights and six tailgate sights distributing over \$7ml in food over the last year. The first distribution of \$200 for the Elders in Need Program will be in July. He provided an update on the Remember the Removal bike

riders. This month in Delaware County the Jay Laundry was opened by CNB, this facility will do all of the laundry for the casinos and hotels. They are gearing up for the clothing voucher program. On Thursday and Friday the first full meeting of the Inter-Tribal Council was held with committees in the last six years. He requested a moment of silence for the Cherokees who we have lost over the last month. Deputy Chief Crittenden recognized Veterans Andrew Crittenden, Cooie Meigs and Arch Vann. Chief Baker recognized George Roach and requested he give a brief overview of the Internship Program and have the participants here introduce themselves.

Monthly Reports:

Housing Authority - David Southerland

Mr. Gary Cooper reported it has been a busy month for the Housing Authority as they are gearing up to build new homes. The June board meeting will be held next Thursday the 19th at noon. It will be on the agenda to change the meeting time to 5:30 p.m. He announced they will be taking applications for the College Housing Assistance Program formerly known as the Dorm Assistance Program on July 2nd through July 16th. To date they have received 770 applications on the new construction home program. The Community Shield Insurance program currently has 2,334 applicants.

Cherokee Nation Business, LLC - Shawn Slaton

Mr. Slaton reported March was the biggest month ever in our gaming facilities. Overall they are doing great financially. The tax contribution to the Nation for the month was \$255,000. He announced several Cherokee citizen promotions including: Seth Greer to Division Controller, Ben Blosh to Controller and Jason Ward accepted a position in the business processing improvement group. A job fair was held June 2nd bringing more than two dozen new jobs to Mayes County, a CNI job fair was held at Mid-American with over fifty attendees. They held an Interviewing for Success Workshops in West Siloam Springs. Our subsidiary, Mobility Plus raised more than \$12,000 for the Kelly B. Todd Cerebral Palsy Center with their 6th annual golf tournament. Cherokee Trails is holding free golf instruction for Cherokee youth this summer. Our Cherokee Heritage Center received the Museum Institutional Excellence Award by the Association of Tribal Archives Libraries and Museums. The Cultural Tourism Department won multiple awards at the Red Blood Award Ceremony at the Oklahoma History Center. They currently have 4,000 jobs with Cherokee employment of 67% with other Native Americans at 8.6% for a total Native American employment of 76.6%. Councilor Cowan Watts inquired if they have entered into a contract regarding our water litigation. Councilor Byrd commended Mr. Slaton and his staff for the outstanding job they are doing.
