Tri-Council meetings were recently held at Red Clay, Tennessee which was our last capital in the East before removal. Career Services recently held a job fair for the Macy's fulfillment center in Owasso. The online Cherokee tag renewal system has been launched. Ground has been broke on the new Cherokee convenience store here at the complex. He commented on the great tool Osiyo TV Voices of the Cherokee People has been. He passed around the recently received Chief's Award from the Department of Interior for our Work Force Program. Chief Baker requested a moment of silence for the very long list of Cherokee passings over the last month.

Housing Authority - Gary Cooper

Mr. Cooper announced the next board meeting is scheduled for the 22nd of September. HUD Deputy Assistant Secretary, Roger Boyd, would be retiring next month. He reported on the assistance provided to Cherokee families.

Cherokee Nation Business, LLC - Shawn Slaton

Ms. Slaton reported they have had a great summer at the businesses and are running approximately \$12ml ahead of the same time last year. In the month of August they contributed \$300,000 in tax collections to the Tax Commission. He gave an update on the active projects. Cherokee Nation Technologies is working alongside NASA to advance weather forecasting abilities. They are celebrating ten years of the best of the Cherokee Art Market with a special exhibit at the Hardesty Art Center on Brady Street. The Cherokee Art Market will be held at the Hard Rock on October 10th and 11th. The American Quarter Horse meet kicked off this past weekend at Will Rogers Downs. The current employment at CNB is 6,479 and have a total Native American employment percentage of 81.7%. Councilor Taylor inquired if the new Outpost Convenience store will eliminate the CNG pump issues. Councilor Lay inquired about the land sale at Kellyville.
