### REPORTS:

Talking Leaves Job Corp/Career Services/Voc. Ed - Diane Kelley

*Ms. Kelley reported the GED graduation was held a couple of weeks ago. They will be hosting the Oklahoma Tribal Re-entry programs this Wednesday. She provided an update on the projects they are working with CNB. She stated there are businesses contacting them to assist in their recruiting. She gave an update on the upcoming job fairs.
