STATE OF THE NATION

> Deputy Chief S. Joe Crittenden gave the State of the Nation in the absence of Chief Baker. Deputy Chief Crittenden announced Chief Baker is in Washington meeting with White House staff over health issues in Indian Country. He touched on the long awaited Freedman case decision and stated we would not appeal the decision. We hosted another outstanding Cherokee National Holiday. Our Marshal's and First Responders have been sent on recovery efforts in Houston as they struggle with hurricane damage. We have collaborated with the Tulsa Chamber and the Oklahoma Commerce Department to bring another manufacturing company to North Tulsa.

Deputy Chief Crittenden gave a list of Cherokee citizens who we have lost over the last month and requested a moment of silence.

Mr. Slaton reported on the last quarter of the year. He provided highlights on the expansion plan at Hard Rock. A meeting was held on the site plan for the casino here at the Cherokee Plaza. The CNB employees conducted a school supply drive for the area schools. He gave an update on the diversified businesses. CNB currently has 6,913 and of those they can conduct preference on they have 73.2% Cherokee, 6.6% other Native American for a total of 79.8% Native American employment. He offered to answer questions from the report provided.
