CALL TO ORDER

Chair Byrd called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Councilor Jordan moved to approve the February 28th regular session minutes as submitted. Councilor Shaw seconded the motion. The motion carried.

REPORTS:

Marshal Service - Shannon Buhl

Mr. Buhl gave appreciation to all of those involved in the effort to be in compliance with the marshal pay increases. Chair Byrd inquired about the canine officers at the Hard Rock.

Office of the Attorney General - Chrissi Nimmo

Ms. Nimmo gave an update on the ICWA case in Texas and announced we have been named in another ICWA case in Arkansas. She reported on the Oklahoma settlement in the opioid case and this effects on our case. There hasn't been a decision or any changes in the Murphy case. Councilor Shaw inquired about the use of "Cherokee Nation" in social media. Councilor Crittenden requested an update on the wood delivery and gardens for elders. He requested clarification on the hay that was taken to

Kansas. Councilor Walkingstick inquired about the ownership of Cherokee Future LLC. He requested clarification on the timeline of campaign contributions. He inquired if a donation to this LLC is a violation. Councilor Crittenden requested clarification on the investigation process if someone has suspicions of violations. Councilor Lay inquired if it is proper to do voter registration in the clinics. Concern was raised for Government Relation staff going from department to department inquired if voter registrations need to be updated or if someone needs to be registered.

FOIA-GRA - Gwen Terrapin

Ms. Terrapin reported for 2019 there have been 21 total requests, of those 18 are GRA of which none are outstanding and the other 3 are FOIA requests all of which are outstanding at this time. She offered to answer questions.

Tax Commission - Sharon Swepston

Ms. Swepston offered to answer questions from the report. She announced the board meetings has been rescheduled to April 24th.

Gaming Commission - Jamie Hummingbird

Mr. Hummingbird provided an update on the new Tahlequah casino. Councilor Taylor inquired about the machine count at the new Tahlequah facility.

Human Resources - Nason Morton

Mr. Morton gave an update on the Marshal Service salary increases. He gave an update on the time to fill position questions.
