STATE OF THE NATION

Chuck Hoskin, Jr. Principal Chief

Principal Chief Hoskin began his State of the Nation with appreciation to the Council for their support in the proposed Career Readiness Campus here in Tahlequah. Chief Hoskin reported on the funds recently spent to help our fluent speakers through our Speakers Services Department. He spoke of the need for contractors to be able to repair homes. Over \$1.6ml has been dedicated to community organizations to assist them in outreach. The Housing Authority Help for Cherokee Homeowners Assistance Fund will provide help to homeowners who are facing some difficulties with their mortgage. The Clothing Assistance Program has been reopened until the 29th of

August. Chief Hoskin provided highlights from the recently held Oklahoma City At Large meeting and the upcoming meetings in Washington State and Oregon. Lastly he urged the Cherokee people to be engaged and vote in the upcoming elections.
