**WHEREAS**, the Cherokee Nation has had a longstanding and positive relationship with the Autry National Center in Los Angeles, California;

**WHEREAS**, the Cherokee Nation is featured prominently in the upcoming exhibit of the Autry National Center, "Empire and Liberty: the Civil War and the West";

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CHEROKEE NATION**, that the Tribal Council offers its support and confidence to the Autry National Center for its fair and nuanced portrayal of the complexities of the social and political realities within the Cherokee Nation before, during, and after the American Civil War in the exhibit "Empire and Liberty: the Civil War and the West," opening April 25, 2015 at the Autry National Center in Los Angeles, California.
